ELIGIBILITY.

To apply for a service grant from the Bonner Community Fund, you must be a current Davidson Student. If you are a community member or organization in the area, you should find a student to represent you.

APPLICABILITY.

A Bonner Community Fund proposal should demonstrate a community need to be addressed. We will not fund an application that does not have direct relevance to the Davidson or Lake Norman Community.

ACCOUNTABILITY.

After the proposed event or initiative has been completed or implemented, a short presentation or evaluation must be brought before the granting committee. This report will be tailored to the nature of the grant in question after funds have been allocated.
